THURINGOWA RSL SUB BRANCH

Australians and New Zealanders recognise April 25th as a day of national remembrance.

This day not only marks the original landing at Anzac Cove, but it is also a time to honour all our servicemen, servicewomen, and service animals from every conflict who have made the supreme sacrifice in service to our country.

This year, I would like to reflect on the first Anzac Day.

While the Gallipoli Campaign was still being fought, the landing at Gallipoli was already etched into the minds of many. It became a defining moment in Australia's history.

On July 2, 1915, the first Violet Day was held in South Australia to commemorate the war dead. During the event, the South Australian Governor, Sir Henry Galway, said:

"If any day is to be chosen for Australia's Day, I think it should be April 25... Those heroes will hand down the finest traditions to their sons and their sons' sons, and still further on."

Violet Day remained an annual day of remembrance for Australian soldiers who died in World War I, observed in South Australia until 1970.

In 1916, Acting Prime Minister George Pearce officially named April 25th as "Anzac Day."

The first anniversary of the landing was commemorated in Australia, New Zealand, and England. More than 2,000 Australians marched through central London to Westminster Abbey, where King George V, Australian Prime Minister Billy Hughes, and Allied military leaders attended the service. Australian troops stationed in Britain, Egypt, and France also attended local services to honour the Gallipoli landing.

In one way or another, we have all been affected by the service of our troops to this great country we call home. As we pause to remember our fallen brethren from all conflicts, let us also spare a thought for those still battling the lasting effects of war, along with the families and friends who support them every day.


