(Hold hands in front of self)

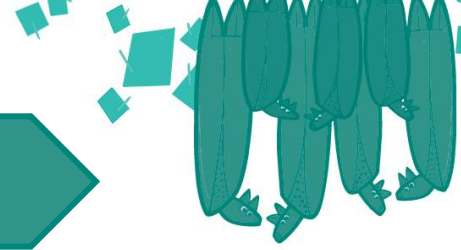

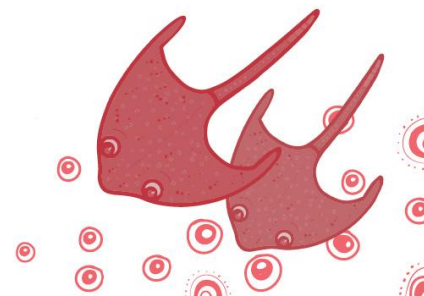

This little piggy had none.**

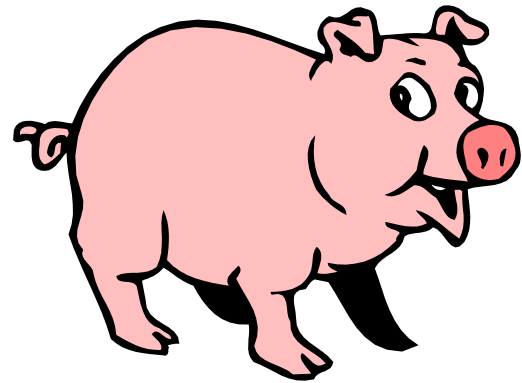

Then he marched them down again.**

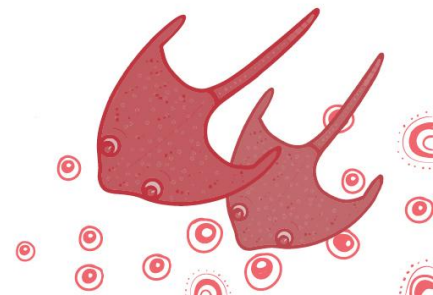
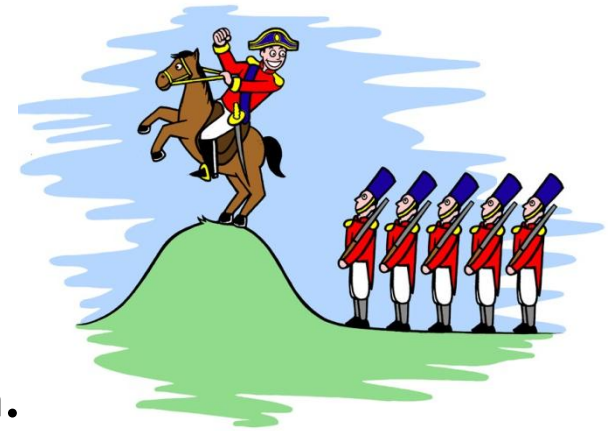
