(hold hands in front of self)

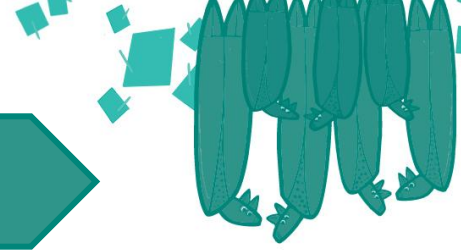
respecting and acknowledging

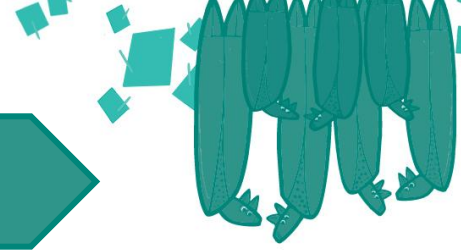

Goo wah - Choo!

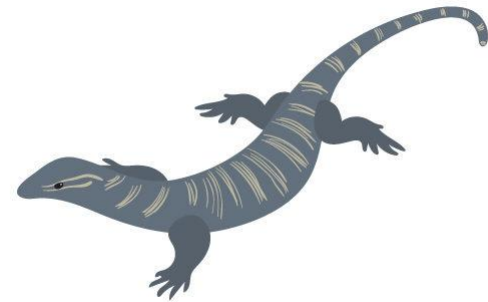
(Fast clapping- hands up for 'choo!')

Gently down the stream.**

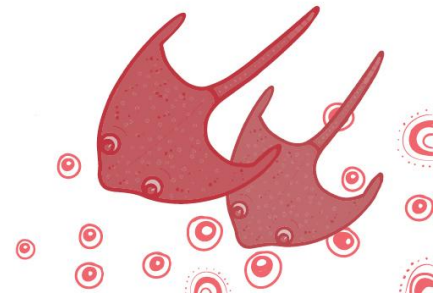
(Rock baby from side to side)

Giddy-up fast.

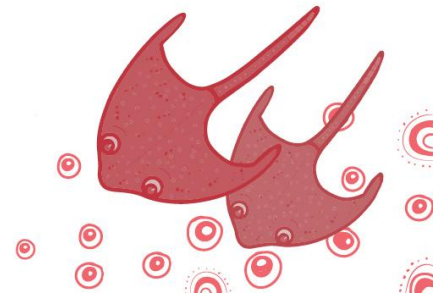
(Bounce quickly)
