Hi, hello and how are you?How are you? How are you?Hi, hello and how are you?How are you today?




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How are you = place palm of open dominant hand on chest. Brush fingertips off chest and close hand with thumb extended.

Emu and koala, emu and koala


(Place elbow on palm of other hand,

Down, down, down, down, down.


(Lower baby, arms or legs down)

Heads and shoulders, Knees and toes, Knees and toes, Knees and toes Head and shoulders, Knees and toes We all clap hands together.


Eyes and ears, and mouth and nose. Mouth and nose, Mouth and nose. Eyes and ears, and mouth and nose. We all clap hands together.

(touch baby)


Put a spot on your ear and a spot on your hair,
